NB: The following rules apply to the boarding school only. During the school day, the students must follow the day school rules.

The boarding school assumes total responsibility for its students, whether for five or seven days a week.

The daily schedule is a balance between time for work and time for relaxation. The support of supervisors, tutors, and directors as well as the solidarity between classmates are all factors which will help you develop your personality and potential, and provide the best conditions for academic success.

In order to prepare your assignments and personal studies, you will benefit from a tutoring service – personalised help from your tutors based on teacher assessments submitted throughout the year.

To make the most of these services, respect for general discipline, a good relationship with staff, as well as an attitude of trust are the essential factors for a healthy and thriving community life at our school.

During class, refer to the school rules; for time outside of class the rules and regulations particular to the boarding school apply.

A variety of recreational activities are offered: hobbies (music, theatre, and sport), entertainment (games, music), field trips (museums, sightseeing excursions) and sports events (activities on the college campus, weekend ski trips in winter, mountain hikes).

Learning and maturing as an individual are part of a long-term process. The boarding school team will be there to support you throughout your stay. Moreover, we will remain in close contact with your parents, keeping them personally informed about your progress; this relationship is based on trust and an open dialogue.

*Respecting this timetable is necessary to ensure the well-being of an extended community such as ours. For this reason **punctuality** is demanded and must be strictly respected.*



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Study time

1. *High School students study in a designated area.*
2. *At the bell, one prepares for the study period with all the necessary materials.*
3. *Students who wish to study together can ask special permission from the tutor present.*
4. *During study hours, a tutor will check on students individually.*
5. ***Each student will keep his/her assignment book up-to-date, where all homework is to be recorded. The tutor will check the homework and write his signature when assignments and homework have been completed to his satisfaction.***
6. *The use of electronic devices (iPods, mobile phones etc...) is not authorised during study hours. Any student breaking this rule will have his or her electronic device confiscated.*
7. *Missed study hours will be compensated by an equivalent study time taken from free time. Absences and tardiness without authorisation from the Directors are not tolerated.*



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Meals

1. *Except for afternoon snack time all meals are mandatory. Any exception must be settled a day in advance with the respective Director.*
2. *Mornings and evenings, students are to come quietly into the dining room; they are to wait standing until the blessing is pronounced and the announcements are made before sitting down and helping themselves.*
3. *At dinner, students are to remain for a minimum of 20mn at the dining table.*
4. *At lunchtime, students go directly to the dining hall; they sign in and have priority in the line-up until 12:10. After this time, they must wait their turn in line as everyone else.*
5. *Proper table manners and respect for the food are expected.*
6. *It is strictly forbidden to enter the staff or kitchen areas. Students must show courtesy when addressing all staff members.*
7. *Sports attire is forbidden in the dining hall.*
8. ***No food drinks, or dinnerware are to be taken from the dining room.***



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Free time and activities

1. *High School students may leave the campus during lunch break following the meal and anytime after class until 17:15.*
2. *Students have access to their rooms during the day, provided that they do not disturb others and behave in a suitable manner.*
3. *Under no circumstances may students roam about the floors. The salon of the 5th floor is exclusively reserved for the girls. **Boys will not enter a girl's room and vice versa.** It is also strictly forbidden to bring in day students. Any infraction will be sanctioned.*
4. *The television in the lounge is accessible during free time.*
5. *Each evening, students deposit their telephone, their laptop computer, as well as any other electronic device for playing games or seeing films in the lockers provided for this purpose. They can retrieve them the next morning after breakfast. Any student breaking this rule will have his or her device(s) confiscated.*
6. *Students do not have permission to enter the teachers' lounge.*
7. *Each evening High School students have sports from 17:30 to 18:30.*
8. *Students with satisfactory grades and behaviour can sign up in a sports club or participate in extracurricular activities. Students are also invited to take part in the school's official evening events.*
9. *High School house students may participate in two evening activities per month as long as they have no academic or disciplinary difficulties. They must ask permission from the Director no later than supper of that same evening.*
10. *During the week, use of a private motorised vehicle is strictly forbidden. Keys must be given to the Director upon arrival on Sunday.*
11. *Any anticipated departure for or arrival from vacation requires written permission from parents and the approval of the respective Director.*



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Weekends

- 1. The weekend officially starts on Friday after classes, and ends on Sunday at the evening meal at 19:00. Any late arrival must be announced on Sunday no later than 18:00.*
- 2. Students staying in the school for the weekend must attend the week-end meeting every Wednesday at 19.30 at the auditoire and follow the weekend regulations. Five-day boarding students may participate in the organised weekend activities of the school. In this case, they must follow the same regulations as the other students.*
- 3. Requests for special leave of absence for the whole or part of the week-ends are to be made no later than Thursday noon and permissions from the parents addressed to the Mrs Waring by writing (fax, e-mail: marie-claire.waring@champittet.ch)). This concerns the outings or absences of seven-day boarding students as well as the weekend participation of the five-day boarding students.*
- 4. Pocket money is to be given at a designated time and place from the Director.*
- 5. Students are permitted one evening out each weekend. Curfew is at 24h00.*
- 6. All boarding students are to participate in one organised activity each weekend.*
- 7. There is a study time of two hours each weekend.*
- 8. Boarding students may invite a day student for an evening out or for certain outings. Requests must be made to the Director no later than Thursday noon.*
- 9. Each evening, students deposit their telephone, their laptop computer, as well as any other electronic device for playing games or seeing films in the lockers provided for this purpose. They can retrieve them the next morning after breakfast. Any student breaking this rule will have his or her device(s) confiscated.*
- 10. Boarding students can participate in Sunday mass with the English parish of Lausanne. Mass starts at 10:30 in the chapel at Champittet.*

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Housing

- 1. At the beginning and the end of the school year, a room check is done with the student. Any damage done to the room will be charged to the student.*
- 2. The furniture in a room may not be moved without approval.*
- 3. Students may decorate their rooms. However, any posting outside of the allotted space is forbidden and repair expenses for any damage incurred will be charged to the student.*
- 4. At the end of the year, students who wish to leave belongings during the summer have to ask the Director and respect the procedure.*
- 5. In the morning, students must make their beds and tidy their rooms before leaving for class. Daily room checks will be made.*
- 6. The school provides wireless access to the Internet and access to computers in the boarding area. Use of the computers for non-academic purposes is only permitted during free time. Any student consulting a site contrary to the moral and ethical code of the school will be deprived of this service until further notice. Any damage to the computer system or to the hardware will be severely sanctioned and the expenses incurred will be charged to the student.*
- 7. Students may deposit their money and valuables in the safe in their room. The school declines all responsibility for theft in the rooms.*
- 8. Use of the elevator is forbidden to all students.*
- 9. It is forbidden to bring animals to school.*

Personal belongings

- 1. Personal laundry – clothes and bath towels. The school provides bedding.*
- 2. Sportswear: shorts, gym shoes, T-shirts, outerwear, a lightweight waterproof jacket, swimwear, hiking boots.*
- 3. Students must bring winter sports equipment: clothes, skis / snowboard*
- 4. There is a laundry service twice a week, Monday and Thursday. Each student will be provided with a laundry bag.*
- 5. Musicians: instruments and scores as needed.*



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Behaviour

1. *After “lights out”, absolute silence is to be observed.*
2. *Eating or drinking, apart from the occasional snack, is not allowed in rooms.*
3. *Music is tolerated in rooms under the condition that the volume is reasonable and doesn't disturb other students. By 'reasonable,' we mean that the music is not audible from the hall, with the door closed.*
4. *Respect of the dress code –school uniform until after classes- and personal hygiene is expected of all students.*
5. *The possession of indecent literature will lead to an official sanction.*
6. *According to the Swiss Law, Smoking is strictly forbidden on the whole campus.*
7. *For safety reasons, it is, of course, strictly forbidden to smoke in the buildings and in the rooms (it will lead to a warning - "blâme"), or to use incense or candles. Setting off the fire alarm system without justifiable cause will also be punished by a warning and the expenses incurred will be charged to the student.*
8. *Storing and drinking alcoholic beverages on campus will lead to an official sanction- “blâme”. In conformity to Swiss law, we tolerate that only those students over 16 years old consume alcohol with moderation when off campus. The school can nevertheless submit students to regular alcohol tests. Any excessive consumption will be severely sanctioned.*
9. *The consumption and storing of any drugs is strictly forbidden. The school reserves the right to test a student for drugs at any moment. If the test is positive or if the student possesses drugs, he/she will immediately appear before the school disciplinary board, with the eventual decision of immediate expulsion.*

Illness and absence

1. *The school nurse is at the students' disposal throughout the day. Students who are ill in the morning must inform the Director at breakfast and then go to the nurse for a check-up by 7:45.*
2. *A student who is not feeling well must stay at the school infirmary.*
3. *At night, a full-time emergency service is available. A student who is not feeling well must inform his Director.*
4. *Students on regular medication must inform the Director.*
5. *For any absence in class or at school due to illness, special leave or early departure, students must obtain permission from their Director.*



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Bonuses

The boarding school council wants to promote positive behaviour and can reward students with privileges through a bonus system:

<i>Academic Work</i>	<i>General Attitude</i>
<i>Sustained effort given in personal work</i>	<i>Camaraderie, sportsmanship, helpful service, honesty, positive attitude, personal effort</i>

Several types of bonuses are available, such as vouchers, cinema ticket, extra evening out, optional study time, etc. The council regularly meets to decide, case by case, the distribution of bonuses.

Boarding school award

At the end of each year, a boy and a girl are awarded a prize for their exceptional contribution to the community life of the boarding school.



Sanctions

Any member of the boarding school staff can impose, among others, the following sanctions:

A student can be grounded for lack of respect, lying, and dishonourable conduct or language towards the housing personnel, the teachers, the educators and other students.

High School students can partially or totally lose their status depending on their disciplinary actions or lack of academic achievements.

A warning - “blâme” - is given for serious offences, for any ill-intentioned act, for putting the life of another in danger and for refusal to work.

The disciplinary council

The council can be convened by the Director in the case of a serious offence or three official warnings. The council is composed of the following members:

- the General Director
- the Dean of Studies
- the Boarding School Director
- the class Teacher
- a student-representative of the class
- a student-representative of the boarding school



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Spiritual life

A house chaplain is available. He organises spiritual activities in the school and welcomes students who wish to contact him. The chaplain's office is located in the villa on campus.

Mediation

A school counsellor/psychologist is available for students who wish to benefit from this service.

Conclusion

In order to ensure a positive and enriching experience at College Champittet, students need to respect themselves and each other, and take responsibility for their actions. Not everything is provided for in this boarding school manual. Frequent disobedience, inappropriate and ill-intentioned behaviour and speech will not be tolerated. Immediate and appropriate action will be taken.
